ShredIt For Macintosh

As most folks know, emptying the trash simply removes a directory address; nothing is really erased. This can be a good thing: remember the last time you hit delete by accident? Still, any user with access to your machine can easily recover your deleted files without your consent. Or, you may want to be sure your personal information is erased before transferring ownership of a computer or drive. ShredIt, by Mireth Technology, ensures that things actually deleted. OtherMenu, by James Walker, creates a system-wide hierarchical menu, opens applications and documents, and runs 28 little utilities called externals. One of my favorite features of this application is a "find" feature that searches for specific strings of text without the indexing that Sherlock requires. Better yet, the author offers a separate
